I am proud to present to you the NAC-Save Our Youth Foundation, Inc. 2010 Annual Report. During the first five years of existence, the Foundation has been a center of creativity and accomplishment. The Foundation in partnership with members of the Norfolk (VA) Alumni Chapter, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. has presented to the community a Black History Month Community Service Award program featuring nationally and internationally recognized speakers addressing the issues facing both youth and adults. The Foundation's Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Classic has grown to be one of the premier amateur golf tournaments in South Hampton Roads featuring great prizes and entertainment for the players, and offering great opportunities for businesses to market their products and services.

Membership dues, corporate and individual donations and funds received from the annual Black History and Swinging for our Youth Golf Classic are the primary sources of fund to the Foundation. In 2010, \$7,480.00 was awarded in scholarships, mentoring and educational research grants. More than \$50,000.00 has been awarded in these areas since 2005, with less than 3% of the total fund being used for administrative cost.

The stories, grants, and services displayed in this Annual Report show myriad ways in which the Foundation brings creativity to bear on all its work as we fulfill the mission of service to the community. The creative spirit drives all that we do in our quest to serve the needs of youth and adults in South Hampton Roads.

On behalf of our Board of Directors and members, I want to express our thanks and appreciations to our corporate and individual donors, and for your commitment to helping both youth and adults succeed in their quest for a better future.

The NAC-Save Our Youth Foundation, Inc. completed the 2010 calendar year very successfully. Keeping its promise to use its resources wisely, the Foundation has provided scholarships to qualified and deserving high school graduates, supported mentoring and tutoring of at-risk elementary and high school students, and other charitable causes

Our vision is to improve the social, educational, and economic prospect of low-income and at-risk youth and adults in South Hampton Roads.

The Foundation's sources of funds include receipts from its Annual Black History Month Community Service Awards Program, Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Tournament, membership dues, individual and corporate donations.

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Simon Says, "Just Tell"

Presented in a non-threatening way, Simon Says... "Just Tell" is filled with all the excitement of a Broadway musical. This 36 minutes production comes with a professional marionette stage, a high quality sound system and sound track created by award winning children's singer songwriter, Norman Foote. The hand crafted marionettes were produced by Virginia's own master puppeteer, Regina Marscheider, an extremely talented artist who had designed more than 400 hand sized to life sized puppets. It is no wonder that this program won an Emmy from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for best educational documentary in 1993.

In this story, Mom is about to get married to her boyfriend, 'Martin'. She is the mother of two young children, Lori and Doug. While Doug is enamored by Martin and all the gifts he bestows on him, Lori has severe reservations and for good reason. As advocates for children and 'happy endings', Children's Performance Workshops and Spectrum Puppets find the right combination of message, music and magic to get the job done.

The 2010 Annual Black History Month Community Service Awards Program

The annual Black History Month Program is one of the Foundation's major initiatives that support scholarships and mentoring projects that continue making a difference in the lives of South Hampton Roads youth. Over the years, the Norfolk (VA) Alumni Chapter and its NAC-Save Our Youth foundation have contributed more than \$90,000.00 in the form of scholarships, educational grants, tutorial and mentoring services as well as social action projects.

The 2010 Black History Month Program keynote speaker was Captain Barrington Irvin. Captain Irvin secured his place in history as the youngest person and first black pilot to fly solo around the world. On his 97-day journey, he flew 30,000 miles in a single-engine aircraft called Inspiration. In 2003, Barrington founded the Miami-based nonprofit organization Experience Aviation, Inc. to introduce other young people to career opportunities in the field. In 2006, he opened the Experience Aviator Learning Center to provide middle and high school students with aviation-related programs that included career guidance.

Captain Irvin at age 23 received the 2007 Congressional Resolution acknowledging his historic achievement and pioneering work in the field of aviation education.

The Program was attended by approximately 400 people and more than one hundred youth were invited from as far away as Richmond, Virginia.



Annual Swinging For Our Youth Golf Tournament

On June 25, 2010, the Foundation will have its 13th golf tournament which is one of its major fund raiser for scholarship, mentoring and tutoring services. The golf tournament is held annually at Cahoon Plantation Golf Course in Chesapeake, Virginia. The golf tournament provides opportunities for corporation, members, and other individuals to participate in an excellent golf outing while at the same time providing assistance to youth in South Hampton Roads.



The Annual Black History Month Community Service Awards Program and the Annual Swinging for Our Youth Golf Tournament are the Foundation's two major fund raisers. Funds from these two event, membership dues, and individual and corporate donations are used to fund scholarships for deserving high school graduates, to support mentoring and tutoring services and other Foundation's initiatives. In 2009, \$15,100.00 was awarded in scholarships to area youth, mentoring and tutoring services, and other charitable projects.

There is an increasing need for scholarships and mentoring services in the Hampton roads communities and schools. The foundation's low administrative cost, stability in its operations, membership support, we can leverage funds from donors to provide quality service to youth. Quality programs that make a difference are expensive; therefore, we welcome both individual and corporate support to fulfill the mission of the Foundation.

Citizens Learning and Educating About Neighborhoods (C.L.E.A.N) Program

Provided funding in the amount of \$240.00 to sponsor four low-income students field trip to the National Black in Wax Museum, Baltimore, Maryland.



Norfolk Public Schools Adopt-A-School Initiative

The Chapter's Adopt-A-School Initiative began in 1998 at St. Helena Elementary School In the Berkley Neighborhood. The Adopt-A-School initiative consisted of a comprehensive instructional leadership league focusing on leadership, academic achievement, social and cultural enrichment field trips, athletics, career awareness, and self esteem/concept development. More than 30 low income students participated in the program, and many of them are currently in area colleges and universities. The Adopt-A-School initiative added Fairlawn Elementary School, Ruffner Middle School Academy, Booker T. Washington High School, and The All-City Jazz Ensemble.

Annually, the Foundation sponsors these schools and the Norfolk Public Schools All-City Jazz Ensemble as a major feature of the Annual Black History Month Community Service Award Program. We attempt to exposed these youth to the best and brightest talents in our local community and expose them to national and internationally recognized achievers. In the 2010 Black History Month program, we invited more than 100 students from as far away as Richmond to be a part of the program.

Annually, the Foundation award each school and the Jazz Ensemble a \$500.00 grant to support mentoring efforts for at risk students. In 2010, a total \$2,500.00 was awarded to the four schools and the All-City Jazz Ensemble.
